SUPERINTENDENT'S **MESSAGE**

On May 20, Valley Central School District voters will have the opportunity to consider two important propositions that directly impact our schools and community—the annual school budget and a capital project proposal.

Proposition 1 is the annual school budget. The proposed 2025-26 budget is \$133,800,000 with a tax levy increase of 2.49% and is designed to prioritize student achievement and fiscal sustainability. We have worked

diligently to develop a fiscally responsible, balanced budget that supports educational programs, accounts for rising costs, preserves an adequate fund balance and is mindful of the financial impact to taxpayers, while at the same time ensuring the stability and long-term health of our schools.

The proposed school budget aligns with the District's Strategic Plan, with a focus on Priority 1: Elevating Student Engagement and Success. This includes introducing a new literacy program that aligns with the Science of Reading, which would give all students the tools to reach high levels of proficiency and achievement.

The proposed budget includes staff development opportunities, social-emotional supports and services to meet the needs of all our students. The budget also aligns with Priority 2: Community

Belonging and VC Pride. By ensuring our interior and exterior spaces are inviting, we can instill a sense of pride in the District. The budget aligns with Priority 3: Clear and Transparent Communication by implementing ParentSquare and Hudl, and updating our website to strengthen our communication.

Proposition 2 focuses on capital improvements and essential repairs to district buildings. Specifically, Proposition 2 focuses on replacing windows at the Alternative Learning Center in Maybrook, renovating Montgomery Elementary School with window replacements and a new gymnasium floor, replacing tile flooring throughout East Coldenham Elementary School, and replacing the water holding tank and installing air conditioning in the cafeteria at the middle school.

These capital project improvements would upgrade our facilities to enhance the learning environment for all students and staff. The improvements outlined in Proposition 2 would have no additional tax impact on residents as it would be funded by a combination of state building aid and the District's fund balance.

At Valley Central, we work diligently every day to create a school district that the community can be proud of—a great place for children. We have accomplished a great deal this year, and our district administrators, faculty and staff look forward to continuing to focus on implementing our District's Strategic Plan so that we can empower every member of our school community to achieve at high levels and embrace the joy of continuous learning. Please remember to vote on Tuesday, May 20. Polls will be open 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. at Valley Central High School.

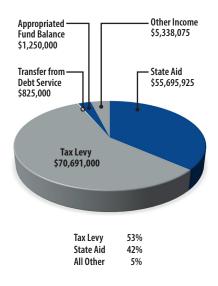

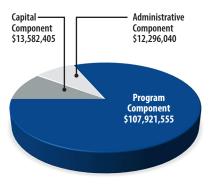

PROGRAM COMPONENT: \$107,921,555 **PERCENTAGE OF BUDGET: 81%**

The program component provides funding for the salaries and benefits of all teachers, guidance counselors, aides, monitors, psychologists, nurses, social workers, and speech therapists. The program component also includes the costs associated with all the instructional and extracurricular programs, transportation and athletic activities.

CAPITAL COMPONENT: \$13,582,405 **PERCENTAGE OF BUDGET: 10%**

The capital component provides funds for the operation and maintenance of Valley Central's school buildings, debt service, property tax refunds, tax certiorari and court-ordered costs, and the salaries and benefits for the maintenance and custodial staff.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPONENT: \$12,296,040 **PERCENTAGE OF BUDGET: 9%**

The administrative component provides funding for the overall general support and management activities of the district, including the salaries and benefits of all professional members who spend 50% or more of their time in administration and supervision, curriculum development, clerical staff, public information, business office operations, and legal and auditing services.
